1.0	ORGANISATION AND ADMINISTRATION
1.1	The Regional Junior League (U14 & 16RL) and all its rights and properties associated with it shall be owned controlled and managed by a subgroup of the Yorkshire Netball Regional Management Board (YNRMB).
1.2	The decisions of the Competition Working Group (CWG), in respect of these rules and regulations and on any other matter related to the Regional Junior League which is not provided for below, shall be considered final and binding on all parties (subject to the right of appeal which is specifically provided for under England Netball's Codes of Conduct and Disciplinary Procedures.)
1.3	It is the responsibility of all Officials and all clubs/teams including Team Managers, Coaches, Captains and Athletes to ensure that they are conversant with the following rules and regulations.
1.4	All clubs will be held responsible for the Overall Conduct* of their players, officials and spectators <i>*Definition:</i> Overall Conduct = You will be responsible for the behaviour, demeanour and actions of all members associated with your club and spectators
1.5	All the Codes of Conduct of England Netball will be adopted by all associated with the League
2.0	PLAYING QUALIFICATIONS AND ELIGIBILITY
2.1	Application for entry to the Regional Junior League (U14 and U16) shall be open to any club which is a member of England Netball through a County Association, which has paid its subscription in this respect, and which is situated within the boundaries of a County Association which is a member of Yorkshire Netball Region – unless otherwise agreed by the CWG. Their entry eligibility will have been determined by the competition structure for that County and agreed by CWG.
2.2	Entry to the Regional Junior League (U14 / U16) will be determined by the CWG at its absolute discretion, subject to its reasonable application of the rules and regulations laid out herein and having due regard to the playing standard of teams which wish to participate. In the same way, such casual vacancies as may appear from time to time will be addressed by the CWG in whatever way it sees fit. At the end of the season, the league will be disbanded, and a new league formed the following season.
2.3	The YNRMB will charge an entry fee to the U14RL.

	<p>For the 2021/22 season the entry fee per team is £55.00</p> <p>In addition, clubs will be liable for court costs as set out in the entry particulars.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ For the 2021/22 Season the cost per game (per team) is £28.00 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ under 14's = £168.00 – Total league cost = £223.00 ▪ under 16's - £196.00 – Total league cost - £251.00 <p>Fees can either be paid per fixture (in the week leading upto the fixture taking place) or in advance at the start of the season.</p> <p>Bank Transfer is the only way to pay league fees (details are available on the entry form)</p>
2.4	In order to qualify to participate in the Regional Junior League, clubs shall either be accredited under England Netball's CAPS or working towards the same where appropriate.
2.5	Clubs entering the Regional Junior League agree that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They will abide by these rules and regulations • They are able and willing to fulfil the costs and commitments of participation in the Regional Junior League
2.6	In order to participate in the Regional Junior League players and team officials shall hold membership to England Netball as a Registered Participant via one of the following qualifications <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Through membership to a club <p>Players must be shown as a Registered Participant through a club as defined in Regulation 2.1 above</p>
2.7	All players must have their membership lodged with the England Netball membership (via ENgage), and their membership paid in full, prior to their participation in the Regional Junior League, or any other level of the competition.
2.8	Only players registered and who have taken the court in this competition will be eligible to play for that club in the National Final
2.9	All players must be over 11 years of age and under 14 years of age at midnight on 31 August/1 September immediately prior to the commencement of the League. No player shall be allowed to play whose age is outside this age band unless the appropriate approval is in place (see age banding details available via the EN website), approval must be on the official age banding form and submitted to the league administrator and is applicable for this competition and playing season ONLY .
	The completed Age Banding form must be submitted with the Team Registration Form

	prior to that player participating in the League.
2.10	<p>England Netball recommends that individuals (Player, coach, umpire) if pregnant should only participate with approval from their doctor and in accordance with any guidelines issued by itself.</p> <p>The England Netball Personal Accident insurance cover excludes any loss or expense due to pregnancy, childbirth, miscarriage or any consequence thereof. If for example, a member who is pregnant is involved in an accident not related to the pregnancy, subject to the conditions of the policy, the relevant benefits would be payable. However, if any situation (such as hospitalisation) was prolonged as a direct result of pregnancy, pregnancy complications or even early childbirth, then this portion of any claim is not covered.</p>
3.0	REGISTRATION OF SQUAD MEMBERS
3.1	<p>Team registration sheets* for each participating club/team must be completed fully for each player and lodged with the CWG prior to the commencement of the League.</p> <p>*Forms for any players age banded should also be lodged</p>
3.2	Clubs may only use those players whose names appear on their team registration sheet held by the CWG during the course of the 2021/22 season.
3.3	Any additions to the steam registration sheets must be lodged with the CWG by 12.00noon on the Friday prior to the fixture, this should be done via email to yorkshirecompetition@gmail.com
3.4	<p>Once a player has been named on a team registration sheet and has taken to court, they cannot transfer to another club during the course of the current playing season.</p> <p>Consent to a transfer may be given by CWG in unusual or exceptional circumstances where written request is made by the player and clubs involved to the Competition Working Group.</p>
3.5	Each club may declare up to twelve (12) players (from those detailed on the team registration sheet) prior to the start of each match by completing a team sheet/result card.
3.6	There may only be one team per club except in extreme circumstances competing in each age group unless decided otherwise by the YNRMB.
4.0	STRUCTURE OF THE LEAGUE
4.1	Both the Under 14 and under 16 leagues will be contested between as many clubs as shall be determined by the CWG from time to time. For 2021/22 this will be two teams per

	County.
4.2	<p>The format of the league will be determined by the CWG.</p> <p>For 2021/22 each team will play each other once, with matches played on the dates specified. All matches will be played at a central venue as per fixture schedule.</p>
4.3	<p>Clubs will be awarded league points as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 points for a win • 3 points for a draw • 2 points if within 5 goals of winners score i.e. 50-46 = 2 points, 50-45 = 1 point • 1 point for more than 50% of the winners score i.e. 6-10 = 1 point, • 0 points for a loss
4.4	<p>The league positions will be compiled based on the points awarded to each team.</p> <p>The following order of precedence will apply where two or more teams are level on points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Goal average (goals for divided by goals against) shall be used to determine their relative positions, i.e., the team with the higher average score over the course of the season shall take precedence. • In the event that goal average does not differentiate between the teams, then goal difference shall be applied, i.e., precedence shall be given to the team with the greater difference between goals scored and goals conceded • In the event that goal difference does not differentiate between the teams, then the team with the greatest number of goals scored shall take precedence • Where one of the teams has its goal average, goal difference or total number of goals scored affected by cancellations, then all goals scored by and against defaulting team(s) in all fixtures shall be omitted from the calculations of both team's level on points. For example, in the event that one team received 5 points for a cancelled fixture, then the goals scored by and against both team's level on points, in all games against the offending team, will not be included when its goal average, goal difference or total number of goals is calculated • In the event that neither goal average nor goal difference nor goals scored can differentiate between the teams, the aggregate score in the match or matches played between them over the course of the season shall be calculated and precedence given to the winning team • In the event that none of the above differentiates between the teams, the teams will participate in a play-off to determine the winner.

4.5	The clubs finishing 1 st and 2 nd will go forward to the National Finals. (subject to confirmation by EN)
5.0	FIXTURE ARRANGEMENTS
5.1	Matches will be played on indoor courts at locations determined by the CWG
5.2	Venues will be booked by CWG
5.3	CWG will be responsible for producing the fixtures for the League
5.4	All matches must be played on the dates specified. All matches shall be of 1-hour duration (i.e., four quarters of 15 minutes each) with 3 minutes break between quarters and 6 minutes at half time.
5.5	All teams will be responsible for arranging their own travel, and the costs of this, and should allow sufficient travelling time to cover any unexpected delays. Any team which fails to arrive for the start time of the match will forfeit the match, and the non-offending team will be awarded the points as winners by default.
5.6	No team may postpone or cancel a fixture. See regulation 5.8 and 9.1. Matches which are postponed due to extreme and unforeseen circumstances, e.g., flash flood, heavy snowfall, will be rescheduled by YNRMB to a reserve date or where no reserve date is applicable an alternative date will be provided.
5.7	If a club/team fails to play a match: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The non-offending club/team will be awarded five (5) league points for the match, and the club/team which fails to play will have five (5) league points deducted from their points total • The club/team failing to play the match will be liable to pay the total costs of the fixture
5.8	In the event that a match is abandoned or not completed for any reason, e.g., because of serious injury, the result of that match will be determined by the Competition Referee, having regard to the score at the time at which play was suspended and taking into account all the surrounding circumstances and facts.
5.9	Any bank charges relating to unpaid cheques must be paid immediately by the relevant team.
6.0	MATCH REGULATIONS

6.1	All games shall be played to the INF Rules of the Game currently in force in England at the time, except where specific regulations may apply.
6.2	Each club shall register its playing kit and bib colours.
6.3	Teams <u>must</u> have a spare set of bibs in a different colour in case of a clash of colours. In the event of a clash of bib colours the first named team shall change colour. Final decision to rest with Umpires.
7.0	MATCH OFFICIALS
7.1	<p>Should ideally be a minimum of B award (and hold individual membership to England Netball)</p> <p>C award umpires will be allowed to umpire in the regional junior league as long as they meet the following</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ recommendation from current accredited assessors (please contact officiating@yorkshirenetball.com if unsure who current assessors are) ❖ must have attended at B course within the last two years (including agreed extensions due to Covid) and should be involved in county leagues/academy training programmes <p>Teams are responsible for paying any expenses to their umpire on the day of the fixture</p> <p>For the 2021/22 season only umpires will not be required to complete the bleep test.</p>
7.2	<p>In the event that an umpire fails to arrive, or is injured / taken ill during a match, the following procedure will be applied:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Competition Referee informed immediately • If another Umpire of the appropriate minimum standard (B award or identified C award) is available, then she/he will Umpire the match • Failing that, the next best qualified (minimum C award) Umpire should be used • If the appointed umpire arrives late and the game has already commenced, the umpire that started the game will continue for the entire duration of the match. <p>Match Officials should allow sufficient traveling time to cover any unexpected delays.</p>
7.3	<p>Technical Officials</p> <p>Both teams must arrange for the match</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. A Scorer who should have a working knowledge of scoring

	ii. A Timekeeper who should have a working knowledge of the INF rules – failing this, the scorer may take responsibility for the timing of the match
7.4	One Scorer (team designated the HOME team) must use the Running Score Sheet and a copy should be retained in case this is needed during the season. The other scorer will use a standard score card which they should retain in case this is needed during the season
8.0	REGISTRATION OF RESULTS
8.1	<i>Teams will complete One Results Card</i> on the day of the fixture ONLY THE RESULTS CARD SHOULD BE SUBMITTED – THE HOME TEAM IS RESPONSIBLE FOR COMPLETING THIS
8.2	The official result cards must be checked and agreed by the scorer(s), both captains and umpires. Umpires ALL names on cards should be printed clearly.
9.0	COMPETITION REFEREE
9.1	A Competition Referee(s) will be appointed for the Regional League. The RLMB may alter the named Competition Referee during the Competition and will, through its best endeavours, inform all participating teams in the event that an alteration is made.
9.2	The Competition Referee(s) will have the authority and jurisdiction to make decisions on any matters arising throughout the Competition including, but not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • altering or amending the playing schedule as necessary. • determining if there has been a breach of the Regulations and imposing an appropriate sanction (including disqualification of any individual, Player or Team) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The use of an unaffiliated player will result in a deduction of 2 league points, the result of the fixture will still stand • The use of an unregistered player or a player who is under age without written permission to play in this league (as per age banding guidelines) being passed to the Competition working Group before participation, will result in a deduction of 2 league points, the result of the fixture will still stand • Failure to play on more than one occasion (e.g. failure to play in 2 league

	<p>fixtures) may result in expulsion from the League.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adjudicating instances of unsportsmanlike behaviour or behaviour that brings the sport into disrepute, including instances of Teams predetermining, or attempting to predetermine, the outcome of a Match and/or the Competition; • Maintaining and being responsible for a confidential Competition Referees Log Book (if required) • Determining the score should any Match not be concluded due to unforeseen circumstance <p>Any matter not covered specifically by the Regulations</p>
9.3	The Competition Referee may call upon, or delegate to, additional persons to assist with the Competition or consult with other persons prior to making any decision. However, the final decision and accountability will lie with the Competition Referee
10.0	COMPETITION COMPLAINTS AND PROCEDURE
10.1	All queries and complaints should be directed to the Competition Referee in the first instance, which will be dealt with as follows:
10.1.1	<p>Where the Complaint relates to the playing of a match, the scoring, and/or its result, the relevant team or match official, must do the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inform their opponents and the umpires of their complaint. • Mark the score card with the words “Under Protest”; • Send the marked score card to the Competition Referee within 72 hours of the match. • Attach a letter to the results card to explain the issue in full to the Competition Referee. <p>and the Competition Referee will decide what action should be taken.</p>
10.1.2	<p>The Competition Referee will acknowledge receipt of the Complaint within 72 hours and where possible a decision will be made in relation to the complaint within 5 working days of receipt of the complaint. Where these timescales cannot be met, the complaint will be informed, along with expected timescales.</p> <p>The Competition Referees decision in relation to decisions taken under clause 10.1.1 is binding. Parties to the complaint shall have the right to appeal the decision under Section 11 below.</p>
10.2	Where the Complaint relates the governance or administration of the Competition by the YNRLMB such complaints will be dealt with under the Complaints Procedure of the relevant regional association.

10.3	Where the Complaint relates to the behaviour of an individual or team participating, volunteering or attending the Competition which could be considered as a Disciplinary Offence under England Netball's Disciplinary Regulations, such complaints will be dealt with in accordance with the processes set out in England Netball's Disciplinary Regulations
11.0	APPEAL OF COMPETITION REFEREE DECISION
11.1	<p>The decision of the Competition Referees in relation to a Complaint submitted in accordance with sections 10.1.11 shall be final and binding on all parties save that a party has a right to appeal in the following circumstances:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • if the decision of the Competition Referees has a potential impact on a Match result, a league table, or the outcome of the Competition; and • there has been a failure by the Competition Referees to follow or act in accordance with these Regulations and/or the Competition Referees has reached a decision on the basis of an error of fact. <p>These are the only grounds of appeal and any appeal must be submitted in accordance with the appeals process set out in section 11.</p>
11.2	An appeal should be forwarded in writing from the Team Manager of the objecting party to the Competition Referee or its nominee within 72 hours of receiving the decision, who will refer it to the RLMB. The RLMB will establish a Competition Appeals Committee (CAC) which will consist of individuals that are independent of the Competition; one of those individuals will be appointed as the Chair
11.3	The appeal shall be accompanied by a cheque for £100 which shall be returned if the appeal is upheld or if there are any other extenuating circumstances. The CAC will decide whether the extenuating circumstance warrant the cheque being returned.
11.4	The Chair of the CAC will send the appeal to the opposing team and any other team that they believe could be impacted by the outcome of the appeal. These teams will be permitted 72 hours, from the date they received the appeal from the CAC, to submit any evidence or submission that they wish the CAC to consider.
11.5	<p>All submissions and evidence must be submitted in writing. No parties involved in the appeal, including the appellant, will be able to make a verbal representation to the CAC.</p> <p>The CAC shall meet (this may include face to face and/or telephone) and conclude the matter where reasonably practicable within 72 hours of receiving the evidence and submissions.</p>
11.6	The CAC will immediately notify all the parties who presented submissions and evidence of their decision and any penalties imposed. The CAC shall have the discretion to publish the decision through whatever media it considers appropriate

11.7	The CAC shall have the power of the YNRLMB to make all decisions and impose any penalties (including but not limited to, reprimands, the deduction of points, fines, suspensions and expulsions from the competition) relating to the appeal.
11.8	The decisions of the CAC shall be considered to be the decisions of the RLMB and shall be final and binding on all participants in the Competition. For the avoidance of doubt there shall be no further right of appeal under England Netball's Disciplinary Manual or otherwise.
11.9	The procedures in this Section 11 shall be governed by the Arbitration Act of 1996 and amounts to a binding arbitration agreement for the purposes of Section of that Act. The seat of the arbitration shall be England
11.10	If the circumstances require a decision to be taken sooner than permitted by this Section 11, and all parties to the appeal agree, the timetable within which an appeal is raised, submissions made and the decision taken can be shorter than the 72 hours stated in this section. In such cases the CAC shall issue a revised timetable which shall be binding on all parties.
12.0	MISCELLANEOUS
12.1	It is the responsibility of each club/team to provide adequate first aid cover for its players and officials, which shall also be made available to the match officials on request
12.2	<p>Any club/team wishing to video/photograph a Regional Junio League matches must give the opposing side, team officials and match officials at least 5 clear days' notice prior to the game to allow all parental permissions required under the Duty of Care to be obtained.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ All permissions must be in written form by all contacts (this may be via email). ➤ A match official/team official who wishes to video record or photograph a Regional league game must also go through the same procedure. ➤ Where filming is to take place, please confirm via email to yorkshirecompetition@gmail.com that approvals are in place and all officials agree to the filming taking place.
12.3	England Netball (including the Regional league) will not be liable to any person, whether in contract, tort (including negligence) or otherwise for any direct or indirect loss or injury of any nature, howsoever caused and howsoever arising from the matters covered by these Regulations, provided that nothing in these Regulations excludes or restricts England Netball's liability for any personal loss or injury caused by England Netball's (including the Regional league) own negligence, the negligence of its employees, or for fraud.

12.4	All participants acknowledge that participating in the sport of netball involves a risk of personal injury and by taking part in the Regional League whether as a player, team member, team official, other official or spectator, each participant does so at their own risk.
12.5	If any of these Regulations are held by any competent authority to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the Regulations shall not be affected thereby.
12.6	These Regulations shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with English law
